About the Silver Acorn

The Silver Acorn is awarded for a minimum of 20 years of specially distinguished service.

The award was instituted in 1932 as an award to rank between the Medal of Merit and the Silver Wolf. It was originally called the Silver Medal but changed to the Silver Acorn shortly after.



On Wednesday 7th March, County Commissioner Liz Walker presented Cubs Akela Sarah Munn with her Silver Acorn award for 25yrs distinguished service. Read what Akela had to say about her scouting experiences over the last 25yrs!

My Scouting journey started at 2nd Edgware Venture Scout Unit. My father was a Queen's Scout and my brothers had passed through Cubs and Scouts so I always wanted to join their Scouting adventures! As a Venture Scout I took part in various activities including expeditions to Austria, Italy and Canada and gained my Queen's Scout Award in 1987 following an interesting 4 day expedition in North Wales!

On finishing Venture Scouts I became a Beaver leader and started a Beaver Scout Colony for the 2nd Edgware group, running a successful colony until my first son was born.
